

## Segment 7 – Isaiah 10:1ff - 11:1-10

### The Assyrian – The Rod of God’s Anger; The Shoot/Root of Jesse – A Righteous Rule

Isaiah 10:1-4

A continuation of Isaiah 9:8-21 “In spite of all this, His anger does not turn away. And His hand is still stretched out.”

Isaiah 10:5 – Assyria, “The rod of My anger, And the staff in whose hands is My indignation.”

Isaiah 10:6-15

Although Assyria is the rod of God’s anger, because of arrogance and haughtiness, God will punish the king of Assyria.

See Jeremiah 18:1-9

God is sovereign over the nations. He can build a nation up, or He can bring it down low.

Isaiah 10:16-19

God will destroy the king of Assyria.

The trees of the forest represent a proud nation

Isaiah 10:20-23

A remnant shall return.

Isaiah 10:23-27

God’s indignation directed at His people, Israel, will end. Now it will turn and be directed at the king of Assyria – the yoke will be broken.

Isaiah 10:28-32

This is a vision of the king of Assyria going against cities in Judah, coming from the north, and getting closer and closer to Jerusalem. At Nob, he shakes his fist at Jerusalem.

Isaiah 10:33-34

The lofty will be abased.

Isaiah 11:1-5

- A shoot will spring from Jesse. Isaiah 4:2; 11:10; Revelation 5:5; 22:16
- He will judge in righteousness. Isaiah 9:7; 16:5; 32:1; 42:1
- He will strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips, he will slay the wicked. II Thessalonians 2:3-4, 8; Revelation 19:19-21

Isaiah 11:6-9

The animal kingdom will live in peaceful coexistence with each other and with mankind. Isaiah 65:25

Isaiah 11:10

The nations (Gentiles) will resort to the root of Jesse (Romans 15:12).

## Segment 8 – Isaiah 11:11- Isaiah13:1ff

### The Remnant; Give Thanks to YHWH; Babylon

Isaiah 11:11-16

The remnant

- A remnant shall be gathered and return. Isaiah 1:9; 4:2-3; 6:12-13; 7:3 (Shearjashub); 10:20-22; 37:4, 31-32; 46:3; Romans 9:27-33

Gather the dispersed from the four corners of the earth.

- God promised a return for His people, even if they turn from Him and are dispersed throughout the earth. Deuteronomy 30:1-4; Isaiah 27:12-13; Ezekiel 37:21
- After captivity in Babylon and Persia, there was a return. Jeremiah 29:10-14; Nehemiah 1:8-10
- There was a return at the time of Christ. Acts 2:5-11
- Is there a return in our day and time? Jeremiah 32:36-44
- The ultimate return at the end of the age will be of both Jew and Gentile, living and dead! Ezekiel 37:7-14; Matthew 24:29-31

This remnant is comprised of people of faith – both Jew and Gentile. Romans 9:1-8; Matthew 3:7-10; Luke 3:7-9; Galatians 3:7-9; Romans 11:17-24

The requirement is “faith,” not heritage.

Isaiah 12:1ff

LORD GOD (NASB); LORD JEHOVAH (KJV) – See Isaiah 26:4

YAH Yahweh is my strength and song!

- Praise Yahweh; call upon His name; make known His deeds! The Psalm of David. Psalm 105:1-4
- These words were sung when the tabernacle was brought to Jerusalem. I Chronicles 16:7-11
- When the people returned to God and received His salvation, they would sing songs of thanksgiving from words of David and Asaph. II Chronicles 29:28-30; Nehemiah 12:44-47
